

## **TODAY A RANGOLI. TOMORROW A HARVEST.**

As part of the **Namo Seva Programme** , the students of **Barasat Girls' High School (H.S.)** proposed to create a unique eco-conscious rangoli titled **“Today a Rangoli. Tomorrow a Harvest.”**

The rangoli has been crafted entirely from seeds, grains and pulses, symbolically portraying the collective journey towards **Viksit Bharat** through themes such as education, women's empowerment, health, water conservation, cleanliness, digital inclusion and sustainable development.

At the heart of the concept lies a simple belief: just as a seed grows into a harvest, every act of service, responsibility and compassion contributes to the growth of a stronger nation. Each grain used in the artwork represents the countless small efforts made by ordinary citizens in building an extraordinary India.

In keeping with the spirit of **Seva Abhiyan**, the materials used for the rangoli will not be wasted. Upon completion of the event, the grains and pulses will be carefully collected and utilised for community welfare, allowing the artwork to continue its journey from symbolism to service.

Through this initiative, the students seek to convey a message of hope, responsibility and nation-building:

**A developed nation is not built in a day; it is grown through countless seeds of service sown by ordinary citizens.**
